Critical Book Review

Senior Students will be required to read one additional historical book per year and complete a critical book review(cbr).

To receive credit for reading the book the students will complete the Critical Book Review. The CBR consists of five components all having equal weight in the grading process.

20%-type of Book-the students must identify the type of historical writing

20%-historical context of the book-students are required to show knowledge of the time period which the book deals with or specific knowledge of the incidents leading up to the writing of the book.

20%-summary or synopsis of the text

20%- Critical review of the book in their own words

20%- New knowledge or insight gained from reading the book.
